Boys & Girls Clubs of Elkhart County and Northern Indiana Axel Partnership

Boys & Girls Clubs of Elkhart County has partnered with Northern Indiana Axle (NIA) as part of Boys & Girls Clubs' workforce development program.

Northern Indiana Axle will host the Club program at their place of business in Nappanee. The first session launched on Monday, January 30, 2024, and will continue into February and March. Additional local businesses will be added as the program grows. Teens will be completing externships, leading to employment this summer.



INTERRA CELEBRATES RECORD BREAKING HOMETOWN GIVING HOLIDAY PROJECT

Interra Credit Union held its 30th annual Hometown Giving holiday service project where staff and members raised a record-


